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- Below the author information, your paper abstract must be printed. The abstracts should be approximately 50 words up to an absolute maximum of 100 words.
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- Consider to add acknowledgements at the end of the paper for additional contributors to the paper who are not co-authors, for research grants received to perform the work, for mentors etc.
- References are indicated by square brackets [1] and are to be listed at the end of the paper. We recommend employing the Insert/reference/cross reference function of WORD to the number of a sentence: Example: Technique Alpha was introduced by Smith in [1]. This ensures automatically the correct numbering. Please double check, whether all of your references have been addressed in the text.

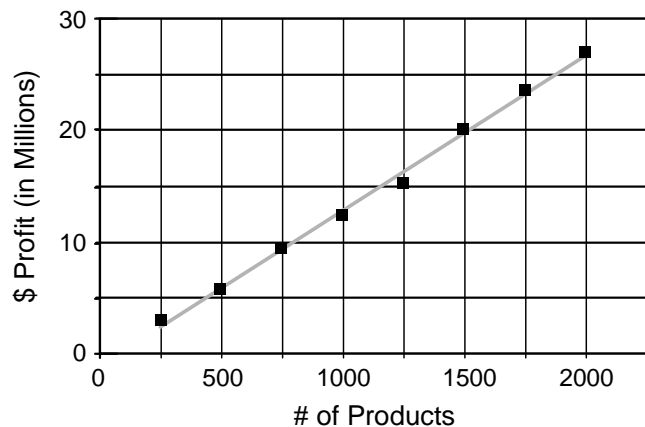


Figure 1: Growth for Technique Alpha

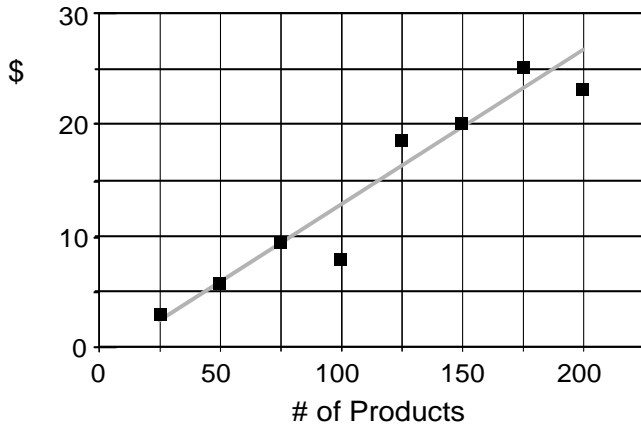


Figure 2: Growth for Technique Beta
